**Inspiration from Nicaragua twinning and
Latin American solidarity in Bradford**



Following a recent visit to Nicaragua, Ludi will share stories of a link that has been re-kindled.

The Tisma Project is a community twinning with a town within the Masaya Department of Nicaragua, that faded in the 1990s and 2000s but has recently re-emerged.

Ludi will also review how Latin American links have grown in the Bradford District. Viva! Bradford focuses on solidarity with social and progressive political movements across the whole continent, and the Caribbean. The educational, policy, fundraising and solidarity activities of each organisation differ and mean a wide range of audiences can be involved.



Ludi Simpson is currently working independently on a variety of research projects. His previous employment was as Research Fellow and then Professor of Population Studies at the University of Manchester, where he retains an honorary post. His long-term interests include the measurement of migration, Latin American demography, ethnicity and demography, and the relationships between government, statistics, authority, democracy and material needs.
